






















In a heartwarming display of community spirit and unity, the students of Rivera Elementary School can now enjoy a fully restored soccer field thanks to the efforts of local volunteers, businesses, and organizations. The project, completed just in time for the school year, was celebrated during a ribbon-cutting ceremony that underscored the importance of community partnerships.

The initiative was spearheaded by the Denton Juneteenth Committee and supported by JustServe North Texas, showcasing the power of collective action. "The connections for the things that we needed just fell into place," said Robbie Evans, communications director for the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints and member of the Denton Juneteenth Committee. "As we talked about the service project, all of a sudden, there were connections of somebody who had bleachers to give us. We had connections for grass, and Tri-Tex Grass was able to donate the 15 pallets of sod needed to cover the field."

For years, students at Rivera Elementary had been unable to fully enjoy soccer at their school due to the poor condition of the field. Instead, they often crossed the street to the Martin Luther King Jr. Recreation Center to play. Recognizing the need for improvement, the community rallied together to give these students a safe and enjoyable space to play closer to home.

The restoration project, which began last fall and wrapped up in May, involved extensive work, including leveling the ground and laying fresh sod. Volunteers also brought in equipment, donated soccer balls, and provided water hoses to ensure the field remains in top shape for the kids.
